MOM Guest didn't spread the word, but it wasn't long before the news traveled *fast*. Rules of the house? Everything is ON the house. Do not stand at attention or salute, enjoy as much food and drink as you like and relax. MOM's biggest delight was getting a hug from the students, and they happily lined up to make sure she got those hugs.



By spring of 2008, the numbers had gone from 5-10 attendees to over 450. And MOM Guest had her work cut out. After three straight days of baking at home, she would stuff her van to the brim with cookies, drinks and kitchen equipment (you might even say "everything but the kitchen sink" and be perfectly accurate!). And the crowd went wild. More than the cookies, the Mids ate up the little bit of home that they missed so much. "I'm able to make it through the week knowing Cookie Cafe is coming. It keeps me going when the regimental lifestyle starts to get me down," says one Mid as he hugs MOM Guest. "I feel like I am home," says another.

As the end of the school year approached, more and more parents started to pitch in by sending cookies and supplies, and a plan was put into place for the 2008-2009 Cookie Cafe schedule. A website was created, and the Kings Point Parents Associations across the country were invited to help out by sponsoring Cookie Cafe events.

And they responded in a big, big way! Were it not for the generosity of KP parents, Cookie Cafe would have suffered greatly. No Mid is ever turned away without treats - all because of you parents who love to bake. And you must admit...it IS fun!

After over 18 years, Cookie Cafe is bigger and better than ever! Many events sport 700+ eager eaters. Carol calls this perfect balance a "well-oiled machine" and a "three-legged stool:"

- Leg 1. Parents who bake cookies and send them
- Leg 2. Parents who come and help on site each week
- Leg 3. Parents who help organize behind the scenes and keep up the communication.

It's a most wonderful way to stay involved and stay close.

THE DETAILS:

Cookie Cafe begins in September and is scheduled for as many Thursdays as possible. Parents and volunteers (and any parent may arrange to volunteer!) arrive at Land Hall around 9 am to unpack boxes and set up table after table of goodies, *hundreds of dozens*, that have been baked and shipped by KP parents across the country. They also set out an array of beverages, fresh fruits, yogurt, bagels, health bars and the like. We also do our best to accommodate special requests from parents who donate.

The Mids start arriving late morning and clean-up ends the day. In between, this is a well-loved, well-deserved break where the kids can unwind, have some great food and enjoy each other.
